Applicant Registration Requirements

To be considered for iNRRTS Registration you must:

1. Provide proof of at least one year of experience as a Rehabilitation Technology Supplier. A Rehabilitation Technology Supplier is a specialist who:
 - a. is currently working for a Complex Rehabilitation Provider that supplies Complex Rehabilitation Technology (CRT) and employs support staff capable of providing ongoing service and consumer support; and
 - b. participates directly in the assessment process by offering a variety of product choices from multiple manufacturers, who offer product categories from different product lines; and
 - c. provides pricing and funding information to the consumer and referral sources; and
 - d. works with manufacturers and/or custom fabricators to combine equipment features to meet specific client needs; and
 - e. provides fittings and deliveries as directed by the referring professional(s); and
 - f. provides clients with instruction regarding the safe use of the equipment, offers information on maintenance and care, passes on warranty information, and supports the equipment supplied with timely, high-quality service.
 - g. Complex Rehab Technology (CRT) Complex Rehab products include medically necessary, individually configured devices that require evaluation, configuration, fitting, adjustment or programming. These products and services are designed to meet the specific and unique medical, physical, and functional needs of an individual with a primary diagnosis resulting from a congenital disorder, progressive or degenerative neuromuscular disease, or from certain types of injury or trauma. CRT refers to individually configured manual wheelchair systems, power wheelchair systems, seating and positioning systems, and other adaptive equipment such as standing devices and gait trainers.
2. Provide documentation of 1,000 hours of direct client patient contact within the 12 months prior to application. (Supervisor's signature meets these criteria).
3. Provide documentation of 1.0 Continuing Education Unit (CEU) or 10 hours within the 18-month period immediately prior to application are required. The hours must be approved for CEUs by an authority such as University of Pittsburgh, IACET, or another authorizing agency recognized by iNRRTS and RESNA. Courses must meet the iNRRTS Core Curriculum criteria. (see next page).

If the applicant does not have CEUs, iNRRTS will assign courses from from the iNRRTS online Learning Portal at no cost to meet the core curriculum. These courses are available for 90 days.



A Minimum of .2 CEUs (2 Hours) From each Core Curriculum Area is Required

Courses must include required minimum subject matter as indicated by the course description and course objectives.

Core Curriculum	Area Required Minimum Subject Matter
Ethics	iNRRTS Code of Ethics; iNRRTS Standards of Practice; General Ethical Concerns, etc.
Funding and Public Policy	Course material must relate directly to funding, legislative or regulatory issues as they directly impact the provision of Complex Rehab Technology products and services.
Medical Terminology, Vocabulary, Anatomy, and Diagnosis (basic)	Knowledge of disabilities; Anatomy and physiology as it impacts seating and wheeled mobility; Basic understanding of other body systems as they impact seating, etc.
Seating and Positioning	Therapeutic principles as relevant to seating and mobility; Impact of seating and mobility intervention on function and health; biomechanics and pathomechanics; knowledge of components of mat evaluation, etc.
Business Practices	Course material must relate directly to business practices that impact the Complex Rehab Technology product and service delivery process.

Application Process

1. As an applicant, iNRRTS will provide you at no cost with the required Core Curriculum courses through the iNRRTS online Learning Portal for 90 days. CEU credit and official course completion are awarded only upon successful completion and approval of your iNRRTS Registry application.
2. Complete the application. Application must have the current employer's signature and former employer's signature, if appropriate.
 - a. Application fee must be submitted at the time of application.
 - b. The applicant's signature agrees to conduct himself/herself in accordance with the iNRRTS Code of Ethics, Standards of Practice and Blind Bidding Policy.
 - c. Receipt of any portion of the application initiates the process. The remainder must be complete within ninety (90) days.
 - d. A copy of your business card **or** email signature that includes your company logo. A smartphone photo of either will be perfectly acceptable.
3. Once the core curriculum is completed, the application will be reviewed and recommended for registration by the appropriate iNRRTS Regional Review Chair (who resides outside the applicant's geographic area). If the application is denied, the applicant has the right to appeal within 10 days to The National Review Committee. The NRC consists of a consumer, therapist, physician and Rehabilitation Technology Supplier who may assist the Regional Review Chairs in determining whether a candidate meets the minimum standards for registration. All appeals must be in writing.



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4. Upon approval of your iNRRTS Registry application, Registry dues must be paid to activate your Registrant status. As an active Registrant, you receive unlimited access to the entire iNRRTS Course Catalog at no additional cost, providing ongoing opportunities to expand your knowledge and support your continuing professional development. You may also request an official iNRRTS educational transcript documenting your completed Core Curriculum and other iNRRTS coursework. Your transcript serves as a recognized record of your professional education and demonstrates your commitment to excellence and lifelong learning in Complex Rehabilitation Technology.
5. Upon notification of approval for registration, the applicant pays an annual renewal fee within 30 days for the first year's dues. Registration begins with receipt of the payment. Registration begins with receipt of the payment. The new Registrant will be emailed a packet including the registration certificate and other pertinent registration information.
6. iNRRTS Registration confirms the RTS has demonstrated current work experience and completed the required core curriculum courses. iNRRTS Registrants adhere to a stringent code of ethics and commit to participate in ongoing continuing education (1.0 CEU annually) to remain a Registrant.

Applicants who have a minimum of three years of experience in direct service delivery of CRT and minimum three years continuous ATP Certification in good standing will be awarded the CRTS® designation upon approval.

RRTS® designation will be awarded to all other approved Registrants.

Registrants with RRTS® designation can earn the CRTS® designation on their second renewal after earning the ATP Certification.
